BRIDGE ETIQUETTE

A small Snapshot of Bridge Etiquette and Protocol.

Above All: avoid any behaviour that would make anyone (especially beginners) feel uncomfortable. Table Manners:

- **Do** greet your opponents
- Don't indulge in lengthy post-mortems, a quick comment or two is fine
- **Don't** criticize your partner
- 'Director PLEASE' is the correct way to call for the Director for assistance

Play of Hand:

- **Do** thank your partner for dummy, even though it's the wrong bid, cards, or no points and you know you are never going to make to contract!
- Please do not 'snap' your cards down on the table when playing your cards. This bends the cards and makes dealing new boards difficult

Dummy's Responsibilities:

- **Dummy** is not allowed to call the director
- **Dummy** may try to prevent any irregularity

Slow Play

• The actively ethical player makes a concerted effort to catch up when they have fallen behind, regardless of the reason for their lateness. All players are expected to develop this good habit

Timeliness

• Please ensure players are seated and ready for a session at least 15 minutes before play is scheduled to commence. If you wish to purchase vouchers, please do this before that 15 minute period. This allows the Director ample time to set up the movement.

ABF AND COVID

In order to provide a safe environment for players and officials at ABF Gold Point events in 2022, COVID-19 Event Plans will include the requirement that all players and officials be fully vaccinated.

For those ineligible to be vaccinated for medical reasons, a medical certificate confirming such ineligibility along with confirmation of a negative COVID test conducted within three days of commencement of the event, will be required.

RULES CORNER

Law 20: Explanation of Calls


When a Player is asked to give an explanation of a Call, they should be quoting the Partnership's agreed System, NOT their interpretation of what the Bid MIGHT mean.

Where the explanation is correct, but the Partner has made an incorrect Bid, Partner should remain silent. No Law has been transgressed as the Player has no better knowledge of the incorrect Bid than the Opposition. Play on.

If the Partner gives a mistaken explanation, including failing to Alert, a Player MUST NOT correct the explanation during the Auction. The Player should call the Director and inform opponents of the incorrect explanation:

When Declarer or Dummy: After the final pass of the Auction

When Defenders: Not until the end of the play of the hand



MORE ON COVID

During the present situation in Queensland, Caloundra Bridge must conform to compulsory requirements from three separate organisations to stay open for Bridge.

Queensland Government

The Sunshine Coast local government area is presently in Stage 3 of restrictions. Specific details for this stage are available on our Notice Board.

The QR "Check In" is still compulsory and if you do not have a mobile phone then we have a book at the door for people to write their information to check in. Please remember it is easy to Check In a friend on your mobile phone QR code check in. Once their name is in your phone you can check them in regularly.

QBA – Queensland Bridge Association

The latest direction from QBA is that we do NOT have to wear masks while we are sitting at a table or if we are EW moving to the next table. At all other times, while we are inside the club room, we must wear our mask – e.g., going for tea/coffee, refreshments, going to the toilet, into the kitchen/office etc.

The wearing of a mask requires your nose, mouth, and chin to be covered.

ABF – Australian Bridge Federation

Full vaccination will be mandatory in future ABF Gold Point events. Medical exemptions are allowed upon production of a Medical Certificate AND evidence of a negative COVID test.
